Endoscopy is commonly used to diagnose ulcers. Scoping can only identify ulcerated tissue in the esophagus and stomach, which completely leaves the intestine and cecum un-explored.

Want to know if your horse might be at risk from gastric ulcers? Palpation of certain points on the horses body can be a very useful indicator.
